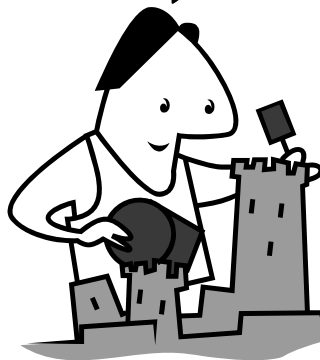

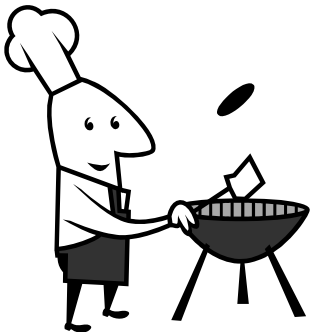

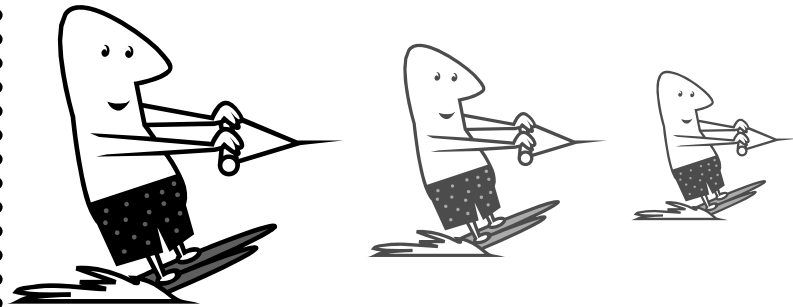
## Air Conditioners

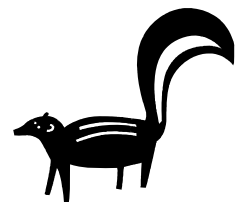
## Beautiful Gardens and skunks???

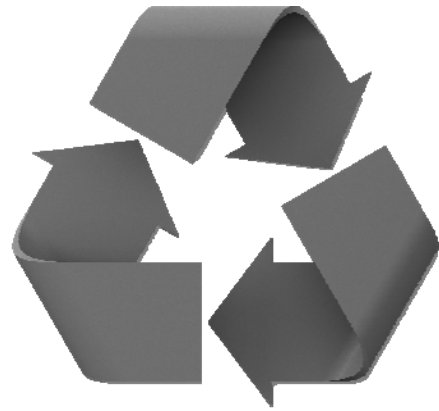

Sometimes there is confusion about recycling. We hope this memo can help.

### **What you can recycle:**

Glass, plastic with the recycle symbol (numbers 1-7), tin cans, paper, magazines & newspapers

- ◆ These can all be mixed together in the tall recycle containers by the dumpster.
- ◆ These items must be clean with no food residue or liquids.
- ◆ Most plastic shopping bags are not recyclable – please throw into dumpster.

#### Cardboard

- ◆ Please flatten cardboard - it goes in the separate wooden bin.
- ◆ Cardboard can't have any food on or in it.  
For example, pizza boxes or the plastic/wax liner of cereal boxes need to go in the trash.

#### Tips

- ◆ Some residents keep two containers in their apartments - one is for trash and one is for recyclables.
- ◆ If you are unsure about whether a piece can be recycled, check with Judy at the Woodside Village Office – 508-693-1367 x10 or Leslie at the Hillside Village Office – 508-693-7577.

### **What hurts recycling**

If trash or food gets thrown into the recycle bins, everything gets contaminated and we have to throw the entire contents of the recycling bin into the trash.

Over - please

***Please remember:***

**All recyclable cans, jars, and bottles**

- ◆ must be empty and clean of food or liquids

**Plastic shopping bags**

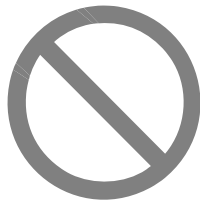
- ◆ from places like Stop & Shop, Cumberland Farms, Granite or other stores should be thrown in the dumpster as most of them are not recyclable.

**Plastic trash bags**

- ◆ are similar to “plastic shopping bags”
- ◆ most can’t be recycled and it is best to throw them in the dumpster so we don’t contaminate the recycle bin.

**Dumpster Area**

There are things we can’t put in the trash or leave near the dumpster.



- ◆ No electronics: computers, TVs, microwaves, phones, etc.
- ◆ No household furniture—inside or outside furniture, mattresses, etc.
- ◆ No floor mops with handles, vacuum cleaners, ironing boards, etc.

If you need to dispose of a large item or electronics, please call Maintenance at 508-693-8318 and they can tell you how it can be done.

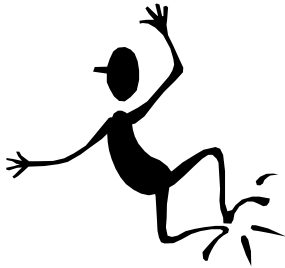
